# A Missionary View

There are two important dates I want to share with you that are upcoming: (1) **Dealing with Church Conflict**Conference with Dr. Richard Bray on August 24, 6:30—8:30 pm, at the GBA office. (2) The annual Deacons'

Meeting for deacons, pastors, staff and wives will be at White Hall on September 3. The meal is catered this year and will be served from 5:30—6:25 pm, and the program begins at 6:30 pm with Dr. Randy Davis as speaker. Ivy Scarborough, attorney, will be on program giving guidance to churches as to steps to take in dealing with the Supreme Court ruling on same-sex marriage. Call

We continue to receive the love offering to purchase land for the new church plant in Iguassu Falls, Brazil. The cost of the land is about \$31,000. We have received around \$10,000 thus far. The Brazilian Baptist men will donate the building materials and build the building. A group of eight (8) GBA pastors will join me and travel to Iguassu Falls on September 29-October 6 to conduct simultaneous revivals and join in a rally with the Brazilians to kick off the construction of the new church building.

The next **pastors**, **staff and wives night** out meeting will be at White Hall Baptist Church on September 21, 6:30 pm. We will serve grilled steak and baked potatoes. We will provide childcare for those who need it. Please, call to let us know if you will need childcare and to register for the meal by **August 18**.

We continue to ask for your support of the Wingo offering for missions. Only 29% of our GBA churches contributed last year. To date we have received \$11,665.53 toward our goal of \$22,500.

Chapel Hill will host a men's conference on Saturday, August 15. "A Night of Orange & White" is the theme of the meeting with special speakers Coach Phillip Fulmer and former UT football player Inky Johnson. Tickets are \$20. Call Chapel Hill for tickets and information.

It is encouraging to see our people on mission with God serving at home and around the world. A youth mission team will be traveling to Romania this week. FBC Dyer will be traveling to Ecuador July 25—August 1. New Bethlehem is serving in Jamaica the week of July 18-25. Antioch traveled to Brazil the first of June. Calvary in Humboldt took a mission team to Alabama in June. FBC Humboldt recently sent a team to Bangladesh. A mission team will be traveling to Cascavel, Brazil September 7-15. The next Brazil trip will be in November.

In light of the ruling of the Supreme Court, the following steps are suggested for your church to take: Adoption of a clear and sweeping Declaration of Doctrine & Belief; Adoption of a Marriage Policy, Facilities Use Policy, Amendment to the bylaws with specific wording, Specifically worded Employment Application for anyone who works for the church from the Pastor on down, and Cemetery Use policy. I am available to speak to any church and offer information and materials to help in these areas.

Our Counseling Ministry Team led by Bett Jewell continues to work with the goal of having Branches Counseling services in the GBA for counseling two days a week.

Chad Cunningham at Truth and Sammy Dowland at Clear Creek have resigned. Bill Rice has been called as interim at Truth. These churches are without pastors: Clear Creek, Keely Mill, Kenton FBC, Trenton FBC, Truth and West Side.

# **Mission Opportunity:**

We often have not because we ask not, so I'm going to follow that Biblical principle and *ask for your help*. The last time we updated our client counseling rooms

was roughly 12 years ago. When we added on/remolded about 5 years ago we used existing pieces of décor and furniture, even then it was partially done with outdated, donated furniture. Currently we still have two other counseling rooms that are horribly outdated. While some of this décor might be acceptable in my home (remember that I am almost sixty years old) it is not the most welcoming and comforting to those whom we minister - women ages thirteen to thirty. We really need to address this as we want to offer the woman who is considering abortion a very comfortable environment that will communicate peace and calm to her.

Testimony from a client advocate about a client she had met with: The young woman had already visited an abortion clinic to schedule an abortion for the next week. The advocate asked her if she sensed peace, calm, and comfort when she came to our office and she replied, "Yes." The advocate then asked her if she sensed the same thing at the abortion clinic. She got a very thoughtful look on her face and replied, "No." We often have clients and visitors comment, from both of our offices, about how the office looks and makes them feel. This is the reason that our office environment is so important and it's the reason I'm writing to ask several Sunday school classes or WMU groups if they would consider helping us to update our counseling rooms. We estimate a need of about \$2,000 to redecorate our three rooms and we have decorators on hand to help us with this. Would you please share this need with your class, women's group and/or church?
