### A Missionary View

We continue to be overwhelmed at the prayer support for our daughter and family and little Levy. Hopefully when you read this article he will be nearing his time to go home or at home from the hospital since his birth on July 27.



September and October have been busy months with the hard work of preparing for the annual meeting of the association, ministry plans with the teams, budget planning, and other meetings. On top of all of these activities, I was in Brazil twice. We had our regular September trip to Cascavel in September. Then, a special trip was planned to take eight pastors to conduct simultaneous revivals and see the construction of a new church building on property that was purchased through love offerings from our GBA churches and individuals. The total received for the love offering to purchase the property in Iguassu Falls (Foz do Iguaçu) was \$29,619.59. In order to protect all church property from outside non-Baptist groups in a hostile takeover, the state convention purchases the church property and the deed is in the name of the convention. Every dime of the love offering has been accounted for as all funds went to the Paraná State Convention and the Executive Secretary personally purchased the property for the new church in the name of the convention. We saw 300 Baptist volunteers from all over the nation of Brazil come to Iguassu to build the church building in one week. A team of 100 men worked until midnight each night. On our last Sunday in Brazil, we gathered together on the new church site in the unfinished building to sing, pray and share with our Brazilian brothers in Christ. What a glorious taste of what heaven will be around the throne with God's people!

Our team of pastors shared the gospel in public schools freely and distributed Bible materials. Several children came to know Christ as Lord and Savior. We shared in a Maximum Security prison and Bro. Joel Pigg preached a the gospel to a cell block of prisoners. At least 21 men gave their lives to Jesus Christ. The team did door-to-door evangelism and preached in homes and churches throughout the week. At least around 200 decisions were recorded, but we know there were many, many more that the team did not count in the total. Pastor Flávio who spoke at our GBA annual meeting in 2014 was the host pastor and is church planter of the new church (Journey Baptist Church in Iguassu Falls).

All of this was possible due to the giving to the Wingo fund. A special scholarship for pastors made the trip possible. We came close to reaching our 2014-15 goal of \$ 22,500 with your gifts of \$ 19, 275.76. This year many gave memorial gifts in memory of a loved one. As of October 1, we start a new budget year so I want to encourage you to help us reach our Wingo goal this next year that is set at \$22,500.

It is hard to believe that we are thinking of Christmas already. Pastors, staff and wives, please mark your calendars for December 3 (Thursday evening) for our annual Christmas dinner at Milan, FBC. The deadline on registration for the meal is Tuesday, December 1. The meal is provided free of charge. We will provide childcare for the evening.

Bro. Steven Dillard has felt led of the Lord to remain as the pastor of Calvary Baptist in Humboldt. We welcome Bro. Mike Roberson as the new pastor of Clear Creek Baptist Church in Dyer. Bro. Bill Rice is serving as the interim pastor at Truth Baptist. Bro. Steve Hemann is the interim pastor at Mt. Pisgah. The following churches are without pastors: Gibson, Keely Mill, Kenton FBC, Mt. Pisgah, Truth and West Side.


